It is for this reason that staff that actually operates the line marking machines will be targeted for these training courses. They will be taught how to mix the liquids properly, how to set out pitches, mark the field and upon completion how to clean their machine and prepare it for use the next time. Basic maintenance of the marking machines will also form part of the training workshop. Trainees will, on successful completion of the course be issued with a certificate confirming their competence in linemarking and machine care.
